

ORDINANCE NO. 1-24-23

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING DEEDS PURSUANT TO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE METROPOLITAN WATER RECLAMATION DISTRICT OF GREATER CHICAGO

WHEREAS, the Village of Robbins desire to accept Quit Claims Deeds conveyed to them from the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago pursuant to an Intergovernmental Agreement entered with them for the 137th Street and Kedzie Avenue Project;

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Agreement by and between the Village of Robbins and the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago for the design, planning, construction, and maintenance of the flood control project of Midlothian Creek in Robbins, Illinois (137th Street and Kedzie Avenue) was executed by the Village on June 25, 2019, a copy of the aforesaid Intergovernmental Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and is incorporated into this Ordinance.

WHEREAS, Article 2.5 of that Agreement states that once the construction is completed, the Village of Robbins would agree to accept ownership, control, and maintenance of the improvements constructed under the Project; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago has provided the Village of Robbins with 13 Quit Claim Deeds for the project area that it has prepared to be recorded with the Cook County Recorder of Deeds, a copy of the aforesaid Quit Claim Deeds are attached as Exhibit "B" and are incorporated into this Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Robbins as follows:

SECTION 1: ACCEPTANCE OF QUIT CLAIM DEEDS

The Village of Robbins will accept the 13 Quit Claim Deeds in Exhibit "B" that will be recorded with the Cook County Recorder of Deeds by the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago.

SECTION 2: PREAMBLES

The preambles of this Ordinance are incorporated herein by reference as is fully set forth.

SECTION 3: CHALLENGE(S)

If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, sentence or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, invalidate, or nullify the remainder thereof, which remainder shall remain and continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 4: PASSAGE

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately after its adoption, approval and publication as required by law.
