Steve stated he was there on behalf of the McBreen block club, they are experiencing a lot of burglaries lately, two on one day. Can the police patrol more often? Is there a direct number to the police and what is the non-emergency number??

Ms. Coleman also voiced concerns about the crime on McBreen and said someone kicked in her gate and tried to vandalize her car.

Chief Scott gave his phone# 708-470-9436, recommended to text him as sometimes he can't answer the phone right then.

Ms. Ratliff asked if we were able to save the brick from the Bel-Air that she requested? Public works was able to save the stone intact and she was asked to come to the front to see it. The mayor suggested it be given to the Robbins History Museum for keeping. Ms. Ratliff stated she had no problem with that, she was just grateful they were able to preserve it.
