The mayor addressed the issue of people saying the village is dumping trash and selling homes. We are demolishing homes and putting the non-hazardous material on Utica, where it can be stored for up to a year. The county is going to help us either by finding the money to dump or we can certify it as a legal landfill. We are not selling homes.

Desiree and Jaceon from Ramone's Baby World, thanked the mayor for the summer camp at the community center and the after-school space. Stated they need some desks and chairs now.

Ms. Waley stated she has signed petitions for the speed bumps on Lincoln Lane West. Also asked about cleaning up the area because there is a lot of dumping going on. Ms. McQueen stated the port-a-potty is blocking the sidewalk where the children walk to school, can it be moved.
